Greetings

In just a few weeks iPalpiti festival returns to LA for its 17th annual musical celebration. Come with family and friends to welcome 32 prize-winning musicians from all corners of the earth in 14 events July 10-27!

Responding to intense audience demand from points south, we begin the Festival with a return to Encinitas, where we will feature five soloists in daily concerts from July 10-13 at their ocean-view Encinitas Library. Take a weekend retreat to Encinitas since most programs will not be repeated in LA.

The Festival will continue with a week-long residence at the fabulous Soka Performing Arts Center in Aliso Viejo, concluding their 2013 season with an iPalpiti orchestra concert on Sunday, July 20, 2pm.

Heading north to Los Angeles, from July 21-27, all of the Festival artists will be in residence at the Petit Ermitage and will hold open rehearsals daily at the City of Beverly Hills' Municipal Gallery. Choose from FREE chamber music offerings at UCLA and LACMA, or salon concerts in Beverly Hills at the Greystone Mansion and the private Leo Frankel Concert Hall, or the social highlight of the Festival, a private Meet the Artists Gala.

For the July 26th grand-finale concert at Walt Disney Concert Hall, Eduard will present a program featuring two young opera stars, and a percussion battery of 22 instruments. Rising star of the MET, Icelandic soprano Disella Larúsdóttir and acclaimed American counter-tenor Daniel Bubeck will be the soloists in Stabat Mater. Considered the most popular piece of sacred music ever written, Giovanni Battista Pergolesi composed Stabat Mater in 1736, during the final weeks of his life, which ended at age 26. The work's twelve movements are named after the incipit of the thirteenth-century Latin hymn describing the Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin at the Cross. The project to bring vocal soloists to an iPalpiti Festival came to fruition via musical discussions between Eduard and iPalpiti's patron James Rigler. The two soloists have deep connections to Los Angeles: Disella as a winner of the Placido Domingo's Operalia and Daniel was a soloist with LA Phil in the 2013 season under Dudamel, just released on Deutsche Grammphone. After the intermission, iPalpiti will play the Carmen Suite by Russian composer Rodion Shchedrin. Written in 1967 for string orchestra, timpani and a battery of 22 percussion instruments, this most unusual instrumentation embodies Shchedrin's desire "to be [as] totally far [as possible] from Bizet's scoring for the opera...without brass and woodwind...giving many possibilities for timbral variety."

It is all for you, our audience: to gift you fabulous music, to show off iPalpiti's artists' extraordinary and diverse talents. Eduard's music-making was once described thus: "He cannot play a meaningless note," and this is what his musicians and listeners draw from him—his enormous conviction of the power of music and ability to convey that to the audience.

Turn to the last page (with calendar in hand), come to one, come to all Festival concerts. You, our supporters, friends and audience, support us the best by coming to the concerts and events, buying tickets not only for yourself but for your friends, introducing other music lovers to iPalpiti, meeting new artists and those you already know.

repertoire spanning from the baroque to contemporary works, Mr. Bubeck made his professional debut to critical acclaim in the world premiere of John Adams's El Niño, conducted by Kent Nagano at the Théâtre Musical de Paris-Châtelet

He has since performed the work on four continents with such esteemed orchestras as Los Angeles Philharmonic, Deutsches Symphonie Orchester-Berlin, Boston, BBC, St. Louis, San Francisco, and Atlanta Symphonies, Radio Filharmonisch Holland, Estonian National and Royal Flemish Philharmonics, and has collaborated with renowned conductors such as Esa- Pekka Salonen, Gustavo Dudamel, Robert Spano, Kent Nagano.

In 2012 he premiered the role of 1st Countertenor in Adams' newest oratorio The Gospel According to the Other Mary with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and reprised the role with the LA Phil in the Spring 2013 on international tour of a staged version directed by Peter Sellars. This season performances include appearances with the London Philharmonic, at Ravinia and Spoleto festivals, and debut with English National Opera.

A noted Handelian, Daniel has interpreted numerous operatic and oratorio roles for companies including New York City Opera, Orchestra of St. Luke's, Carmel Bach Festival, St. Thomas Fifth Ave and Opera Vivente. Other career highlights include excerpts from Phillip Glass' Akhnaten with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Henze's Das verratene Meer with the Tokyo Symphony, the role of Oberon in Britten's A Midsummer Night's Dream at the Princeton Festival, a recital tour in China, Messiah and St. Matthew Passion with American Bach Soloists, Carmina Burana in São Paulo, Brazil and others.

Daniel Bubeck can be heard on recordings of John Adams' El Niño (Nonesuch CD/Art Haus Musik DVD), The New Four Seasons with Musica Sequenza (Deutsche Harmonia Mundi, Sony Music), on the soundtrack of the Warner Brothers thriller, I Am Legend, and a featured soloist on Deutsche Gramophone release of John Adams' "Gospel According to the Other Mary" with the LA Phil.

A native of Wilmington, Delaware, he holds music degrees from Indiana University, Peabody Conservatory and the University of Delaware. He also studied at the Britten-Pears School in Aldeburgh, UK, and at the Salzburg Mozarteum. www.danbubeck.com

During the 2012-2013 season, Ms. Làrusdóttir made her Metropolitan Opera debut as Garsenda in Zandonai's Francesca da Rimini, and performed the role of Woglinde in Wagner's Götterdämmerung and Das Rheingold. During the 2013-2014 season, she returns to the Metropolitan Opera for its productions of Britten's A Midsummer Night's Dream, Strauss' Die Frau Ohne Schatten, Mozart's Die Zauberflöte, Donizetti's L'Elisir d'Amore, Dvořák's Rusalka, Rossini's La Cenerentola, Bellini's La Sonnambula, and the Baroque pastiche, The Enchanted Island.


